9/29/2016	USA Today endorses Hillary Clinton, ending a 34-year tradition of neutrality in the presidential race.
9/30/2016	Donald Trump sends several tweets at around 3 a.m. attacking former Miss Universe Alicia Machado, who Clinton raised in the first presidential debate, for being a 'con,' 'the worst,' and 'disgusting,' and claiming that she appeared in a sex tape.
10/1/2016	Hillary For America reports its strongest month of fundraising yet, raising \$154 million in September.
10/1/2016	The New York Times publishes a story showing Trump could have avoided paying any income tax for nearly two decades, based off documents they received from an anonymous sender.

10/4/2016	Vice Presidential debate between Mike Pence and Tim Kaine at Longwood University, moderated by Elaine Quijano.
10/7/16	A videotape is released of Donald Trump talking with Billy Bush of Access Hollywood in 2005 where he brags in vulgar terms about kissing, groping and trying to have sex with women. Trump's response: "This was locker room banter, a private conversation that took place many years ago. Bill Clinton has said far worse to me on the golf course – not even close. I apologize if anyone was offended."
10/8/2016	Hurricane Matthew hits Florida.
10/9/2016	Donald Trump holds pre-debate press conference with women who have accused former President Clinton of sexual assault.
10/9/2016	Second presidential election debate at Washington University, moderated by Martha Raddatz and Anderson Cooper.
10/10/2016	Paul Ryan says he will no longer defend Donald Trump.
10/11/2016	Clinton campaign chair John Podesta says the FBI is investigating a "criminal hack" of his private email account.
10/11/2016	Donald Trump tweets "Disloyal R's are far more difficult than Crooked Hillary" and "the shackles have been taken off me."
10/12/2016	People Magazine reporter Natasha Stoyneff, who covered Donald Trump in the early 2000s, writes that he once sexually assaulted her. Three other women accuse Donald Trump of previously groping or kissing them without consent.
10/12/2016	Donald Trump says the Islamic State will take over the West if Hillary Clinton is elected president.

10/18/2016	President Obama tells Donald Trump to “stop whining” and calls Trump’s voter fraud arguments “unprecedented.”
10/19/2016	Third presidential election debate at University of Nevada, Las Vegas, moderated by Chris Wallace. Donald Trump calls Hillary Clinton a “nasty woman.”
10/20/2016	Donald Trump announces at a campaign rally that he will accept the results of the election if he wins.
10/20/2016	Donald Trump and Hillary Clinton speak at the Alfred E. Smith Memorial Dinner. Trump is booed by the crowd.
10/22/2016	Donald Trump vows to sue the women who accused him of sexual misconduct.
10/28/2016	A former Miss Finland becomes the twelfth woman to come forward and accuse Donald Trump of sexual assault.
10/28/2016	Vladimir Putin denies accusations of meddling in the U.S. election.
10/28/2016	FBI Director James Comey sends letter to congressional leaders that the FBI will investigate whether additional classified material is contained in emails sent using Hillary Clinton’s private email server.
